

# **School Climate and Attendance**

Playworks, recognized as a Tier 1 evidence-based intervention under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), has a statistically significant impact on key school climate indicators such as reducing bullying, improving safety, and increasing students' readiness to learn. These improvements in school climate are directly linked to better attendance outcomes, particularly among chronically absent students.

### TIER 1 Evidence Controlled Studies



Teachers in Playworks schools reported significantly less bullying and exclusionary behavior during recess\*, a 43% difference in average rating scores.



Playworks teachers' average rating of students' feelings of safety at school was 20% higher than the average ratings reported by teachers in control schools.

# Playworks increases attendance & reduces chronic absenteeism

# Why School Climate Matters

A positive school climate is crucial for improving student attendance. Research shows that schools with a strong sense of safety, inclusion, and engagement see fewer absences and better overall student outcomes.
