Throughout the year, I collected countless stories of our impact in school and out-of-school time spaces. I'll share just one below, funny enough it's from the very first day of programming. I think it speaks to the power of play: If Coach Nick was able to accomplish this in one day, imagine the cumulative impact he had at this school after a whole year.

"Positive review on day 1, from me! I saw Coach [Nick] helping students learn how to problem solve and play fairly. Students waving him down in the halls, eager to please at morning recess. And at the dinner table this evening, [my son] shared that he was invited to play soccer today with "new kids" and "it was the funnest recess I've ever had." [He] has always struggled to join other children in free play like recess, but today it was facilitated, healthy, and he says he can't wait for recess tomorrow! This coach is a positivity magnet. Celebrating this as both a parent and as a teacher. Thanks so much for bringing this in!"

THE YEAR IN REVIEW: BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

The theme of the 2023-24 program year was "building momentum."

At every level, our team worked to enhance capacity, resources, and best practices that will help us expand our impact in the Northern California region.

Some highlights:



New partnership tools:

Two dedicated groups of program, partnerships and development team members collaborated for 8 months to create a school prioritization tool and a service match assessment that will allow us to better cultivate long-term partnerships and encourage multi-year engagements.

Collaborative strategic planning

Staff input including, managers and direct service providers, guided our long term goal setting. They identified district systems change and out-of-school time partnerships as strategic priorities and were the key drivers of the initial research and learnings which will inevitably shape our upcoming strategic plan.

Board led initiatives:

Regional Advisory Board Members helped identify new geographies for programmatic expansion including rural spaces like Butte and Shasta County as well as agricultural spaces like Fresno and Madera County. They also brainstormed how to better leverage our digital services to bring safe and healthy play to more students.

UP NEXT: BFYOND THE BAY



During the 2023-24 program vear we continued to leverage strategic partnerships to expand our impact beyond the Bay Area. Our collaboration with Madera Unified School District is just one example of these successes:

Madera's climate is the perfect metaphor for the rest of its story. Hot and dry, with little rainfall, nutrients don't go deep into its soil. For something to work in Madera it must be adaptive and creative. Playworks' partnership with Madera Unified School District was exactly that

Unable to hire a fleet of recess staff for every school, Madera Unified cleverly leveraged its resources to instead hire two full time staff positions. Student Advocates, to be the holders and drivers of Playworks' tried and true recess practices.

Playworks trained Madera's Student Advocates and worked alongside the Culture and Climate Department to equip them with the tools and resources they needed to implement safe and healthy play through the district. Through this collaborative partnership we were able to pour recess resources into Madera's community.

As we look towards the next program year, we look forward to a continued partnership with Madera USD and to many new partnerships beyond the bay.
