Ro Sham Bo (rock-paper-scissors) is now a vital part of our school community and has helped to resolve many conflicts through student-led collaboration and problem solving. The Junior Coach youth leaders in my class understand steps to support other students who are in need. They are keen on determining what the root issue is in a situation, rather than jumping to conclusions. Overall, they are becoming excellent at problem solving for themselves and collaboratively to help others."
